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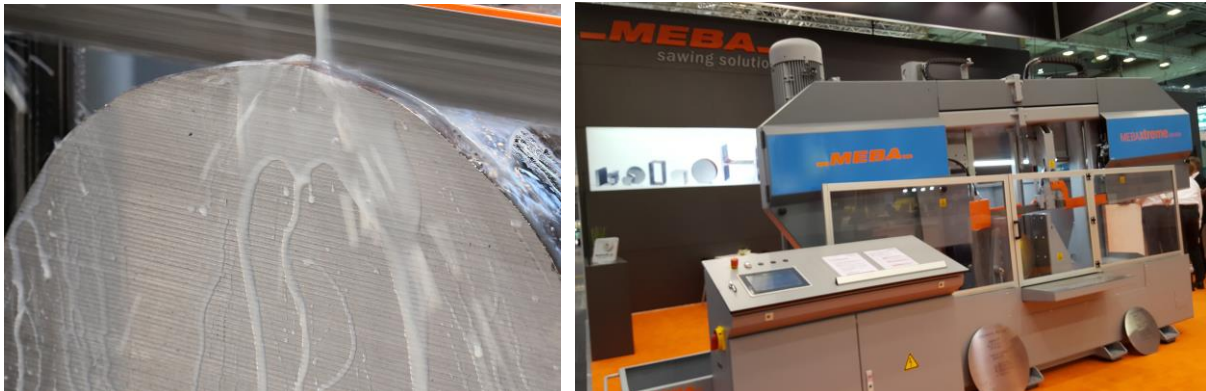

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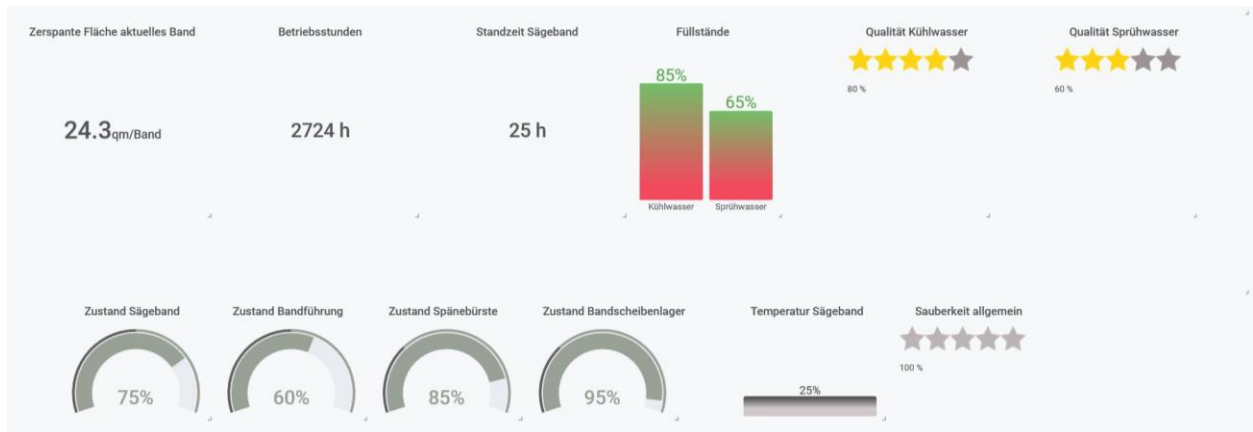
Industry specialist MEBA draws a positive conclusion: new products at the EMO in Hanover meet with great interest.

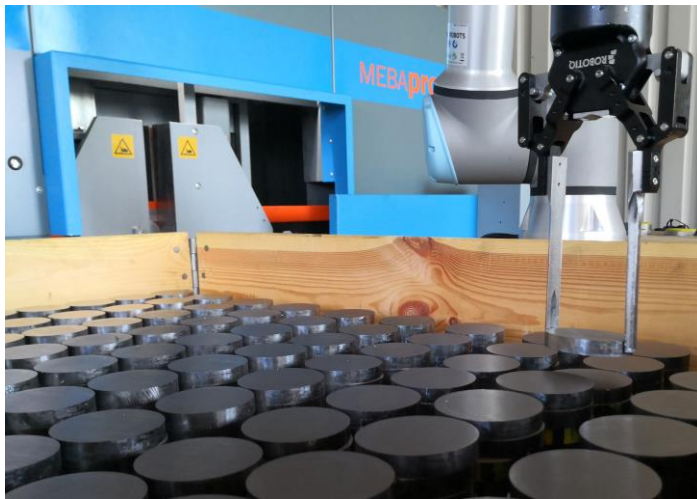
The new MEBA thin-cutting technology, demonstrated on the semi-automatic machine for extreme sawing tasks, MEBAxtreme, was developed as a visitor magnet. The enormous savings potential of this technology impressed prospective customers from all over the world at the MEBA booth: up to 5 times higher cutting performance than previous systems and thus significantly lower costs per cut. Up to 35% less waste and consequently lower waste costs due to the reduced cutting channel. An unequalled fast cut with up to 80% less sawing time. In summary, the investment pays for itself in just 6 months. The live demonstrations of the thin-cutting technology were particularly well received by the visitors, who impressively demonstrated the facts in practice.



At the "mav industrie 4.0 area", the company presented the new MEBAapp in addition to other innovations for networked sawing: The notification and evaluation medium for the current machine and order status. The real-time information combined with clear recommendations for action before the machine reaches a standstill was very well received by the visitors. The resulting benefits in particular, such as increased productivity and quality thanks to an overview of all parameters, optimised staff deployment thanks to an overview of the machining order and increased machine availability thanks to early fault detection, were particularly convincing..



Another visitor highlight of the MEBA exhibition in Hanover was the automation with robot technology. Using the compact, space-saving 90° automatic MEBApro 260 AP as an example, MEBA underscored its ongoing activities and expertise in the field of automation to increase productivity and reduce costs per cut.
